- The potential to link with other initiatives

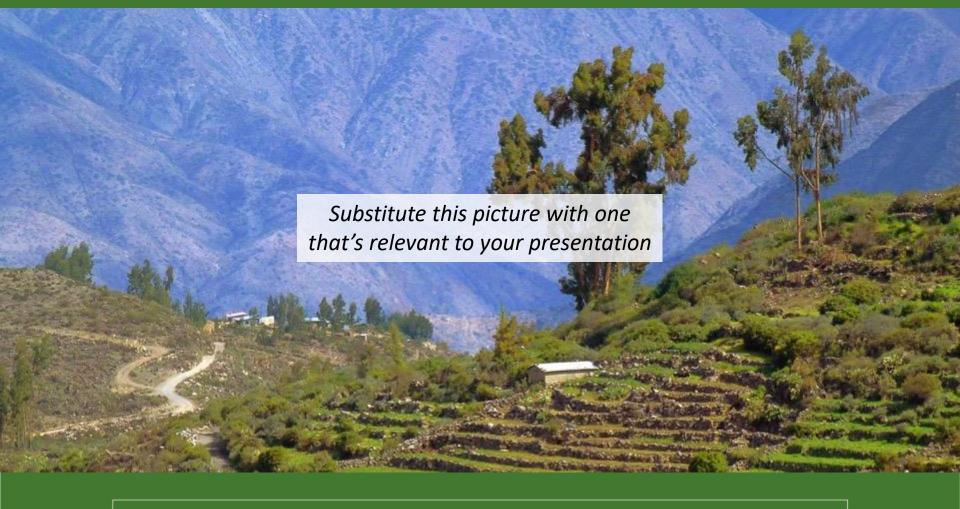


RT question 3
