



Asia-Pacific Forest Outlook: Roadmaps for primary forests conservation and innovative forest technologies

Geographical scope

The scope of the roadmaps covers the countries of the FAO region of Asia and the Pacific (FAO-RAP perimeter).¹ However, it excludes France and the United States of America (USA) mainland situated outside the region. The Russian Federation, although covering 29 percent of Asia, is also excluded because issues related to Russian forests are usually discussed within the European Forestry Commission. The scope of the roadmaps includes in particular the Islamic Republic of Iran, previously included in the Near East FAO region, that recently joined the Asia-Pacific FAO region. It also includes five sovereign states in free association with New-Zealand or with the USA, as well as nine French and USA dependent territories situated in the region.²

Table 1 below lists all the 49 countries and territories included in the scope.

The roadmaps, and particularly the study on primary forests, will be based on the latest FRA2020 data, recently made available. For the purpose of the FRA2020³, all contributing countries and territories are classified in regions and sub-regions. The scope of the roadmaps corresponds broadly to:

- the FRA2020 region of Oceania; and,
- in Asia, the two FRA2020 sub-regions of: (i) East Asia; and, (ii) South and Southeast Asia.
- Afghanistan and the Islamic Republic of Iran that are, for the purpose of the FRA2020, included in Western and Central Asia.

Although included in the FRA2020 region of Oceania, Pitcairn will be excluded from the study because its mother country (UK) is not member of FAO-RAP.

Table 2 shows the slight differences between the scope of the roadmaps on one hand, and the APFSOS III, ⁴ APFC⁵ perimeters on the other hand. These differences will need to be accounted for when making comparisons with statistics computed for APFC or APFSOS III.
