



## Do we need to practice "triage"?

- When is a remnant primary forest too small to be "saved"?
- Do we need to invest resources into ecosystems we believe are very likely doomed (e.g. montane cloud forests or dry forests of the Pacific Islands)?
- How do we prioritize for the largest efficiency to the dollar invested?
